As well, we are introducing a ministry for a Visiting Team; this ministry was approved by Session at the September meeting. This concept and team has been developed as I have come to realize that I am not able to visit, on a regular basis, the many people who are part of the church family but are unable to attend worship for any number of reasons. It is so important that people know that they are not forgotten by the church.

Our pastoral care happens in many forms in the church. The Caring and Contact team writes cards and makes phone calls to this group of people, providing a special link to church. Caring and Contact also provides a friendly welcome on weekday mornings for those who call or visit the church.

The newly-created Visiting Ministry is part of a whole pastoral care ministry which includes the Prayer Shawl ministry, Caring and Contact, Ushers, Greeters, the Parish Nurse Ministry, the Lunch with a Difference Ministry, the Mission and Outreach Ministry, contact with Elders and the volunteers who gathers once a month to aid residents in being able to attend our worship service at Grandview Lodge.

For the September service at Grandview, I used a passage from 1 John 4:11-12 as the basis for the service and the message. It reads, "Beloved, since God loved us so much, we also ought to love one another. No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God lives in us, and his love is perfected in us."

The most valuable gift we can give one another is love. This church has a wonderful capacity for love and for caring. May everyone who we encounter, in this building and beyond its walls, experience the love of God because we have loved them as shown by our care for them.
