From Rev. Joyce

During every worship service, you will hear the line, or some variation of the line, "our tithes and offerings will now be received." Many years ago, I kind of thought of this as the business portion of my worship. I understood on some level that the offering was in response to what God has given me, but the full depth of that understanding has only come in more recent years. At first, it was being asked to be on the board of managers in my home congregation that helped me to understand the full cost of ministry. That was an eye opener! I have heard others say the same thing here at St. Andrew's, when they became aware of the actual financial cost of ministry. Last week the Facilities and Finance team had a message in the newsletter that shared that as a congregation we are falling considerably short of meeting the budget accepted at the annual meeting. In the next weeks, the committee plans to share some actual costs of ministry to help everyone become more aware. These numbers are important.

In light of this, it makes one ponder what is our motivation for giving or tithing, and what does it mean to be stewards? Let's start with the thought that giving to the church is not done from a place of obligation or duty, though that may be some part of it. A more important point may be that the idea of stewardship is to live a generous lifestyle in response to how generous God has been to us. It is about our whole lives and our love for God and others.

Over the next few weeks, let us consider together the idea of stewardship.

Presbyterians

Presbyterian World Service & Development's Girls Education Project team conducted meetings in Tasal's village to teach members of the community about the ways that an education can help girls and boys access opportunities for brighter futures. At the end of the session, Zaman was inspired to enroll his son at the local school. "I now understand that it is not only his right to go to school but it is also my responsibility to encourage him and support him," shares Zaman.
