From Rev. Joyce

Happy New Year! Now before you think I have lost it, let me explain. Today, Christ the King or Reign of Christ Sunday, marks the end of the Christian calendar. It is the last Sunday before we begin again with Advent. Today is a day to celebrate that Christ is king and reigns in a kingdom that is not bound by borders created by human minds and hands. Christ's kingdom is also more than out there in some heavenly place. Christ's kingdom is in our hearts and in our relationships. The power that Christ holds over his people is the power of love and it is by that love given freely to us that we are able to live our own lives in the power of love.

This is not some airy fairy love, this is deep, genuine, and profound love that we are to have for each other simply because we are human and value life and each person's life. Not easy to do when you think about the people you may find difficult or challenging to deal with, and particularly given the violence that we have witnessed in the news. Still, we are called to love; that is who God is, and that is what God's kingdom is about, and love usually has a cost.


