



# From Rev. Joyce

Oh come, oh come, Emmanuel, and ransom captive Israel, that morns in lowly exile here, until the Son of God appear. Rejoice, rejoice! Emmanuel shall come to thee, O Israel.



These familiar words, the beginning of a poem which includes more verses like the first, are believed to have been penned in Latin in the 13<sup>th</sup> century. The words along with the haunting melody of Gregorian plainsong (think monks singing), and which we now sing, are heard in stark contrast to what we are experiencing each time we walk into a store at this time of year.

Even our sanctuary, beautifully decorated as it is, does not reflect the sense of waiting that is really the essence of the season of Advent. If you desire to truly honour the story of Christ's birth and the Christmas story, your spiritual practice could include times of quiet reflection on the truly amazing gift of God, come in the most vulnerable form possible – a human baby.
