

How do we use our gifts? In the scripture readings, I am focused on 1 Corinthians 12, which are all about our gifts; this is something that I have been pondering for some time. This week a phone call reminded me of a time about eight years ago when I was stretching my time and gifts to the max., and the reward was burnout. There have also been times when I have been less then generous with my time and gifts, and that just led to a feeling of not giving my best to God. Discovering our gifts is a process. Discerning when and how to use them is also a process. For people who have multiple gifts, it is likely that God is not calling you to use all of them all at the same time. For those who think they have few or no gifts from God whatsoever, that is likely not truth either. God loves people and we are given gifts of the Spirit for use in God's kingdom.

Using our gifts will bring joy, but that does not mean that it will not bring with it challenge as well. I have most often found that God has taken gifts that I have and used them in ways I would not have thought of, or would have considered I was capable of doing. Many times, it was others asking me to do something, and I took time to pray and even ask others if they thought that this was an area that I had gifts with which to serve, before I committed to anything.

I think what I am saying is that figuring out our gifts, how to use them, and for how long, is an ongoing part of our faith journey. If you have any desire to explore your gifts, ask someone to walk alongside you.

I would also be honored to be part of your journey.

In response to Christ's call to serve and defend the vulnerable and the persecuted, Presbyterian World Service & Development provides humanitarian aid to refugees worldwide, while promoting and protecting their rights.

This past year, the Pickering Presbytery Mission and Outreach Committee headed a refugee sponsorship project with support from PWS&D. An outpouring of generosity from member churches allowed the presbytery to raise enough money to sponsor not one, but five Syrian families escaping violent conflict. "Although many of the churches in our presbytery are small, as partners together we have been able to do something really meaningful," said Liz Stark, a member of the Pickering committee. In generosity, faith and partnership, Presbyterians are helping refugees on their journey toward peace.
