From Rev. Joyce

"We worship and work as a part of the whole body of Christ present in the world. In many voices and languages, many sounds and rhythms, we sing the story of where we have been with God and where God is leading us." - Presbyterian Church in Canada *The Book of Praise 1997.*



This congregation actually had a hand in what has become our hymn book because Rev. Keith Boyer, minister of St. Andrew's at the time, was the convenor of the hymn book committee that was set with the task of publishing a hymn book that would honor our past yet give us words and music for a current generation.

Music can move the body and soul in a way that words alone cannot. Often people will be able to tell you what hymns were sung (or not sung!) in a worship service but not be able to remember what the scriptures were or what the sermon was about. It may be because music connects all the pieces together of poetry, story, scripture, and theology, and puts it into a form that connects us to our bodies. We get to see and hear the words, but we also get to hear the words and listen to the way the melodies and harmonies move up and down. Then we come to feel the rhythms and vibrations in our bodies from the instruments that are used, but also from our voice that resonates throughout our body. Our voices lifted together in the singing of hymns and songs connects us to each other and opens up an opportunity for the Spirit of God to move together with us to inspire, comfort, challenge and grow us.
