PWS&D Responds to Floods in Pakistan

In 2015, the district of Sajawal in Pakistan experienced the worst flooding in years. Heavy, monsoon rains compounded with melting glaciers in the north washed away homes, roads and infrastructure. Over 200 people lost their lives in the devastating torrent. When waters receded, fields and crops were damaged, meaning many farm families went hungry. In response, Presbyterian World Service & Development, in partnership with Canadian Food grains Bank, provided emergency food packages to meet the nutritional needs of over 2,000 families affected by the flood. The food packages—containing flour, legumes, oil and salt—relieved families of hunger for five consecutive months and brought renewed strength to those beginning to rebuild their livelihoods.

Since January I have been participating in an online course the last Wednesday of the month and it runs until the 3rd week of June. The course is called *Starting Well* and is an opportunity for ministers, in their first years of ministry, to reflect on their experiences and also get some instruction on such things as conflict resolution, group dynamics, time management, and self-care. It is offered through the Toronto School of Theology which has seven Christian denominations involved. Both the instructors happen to be Presbyterian ministers and this year all of the participants are also Presbyterians. A number of the participants were fellow-students in my years at seminary.

One requirement of the course is that each person must prepare a case study to present to the class. The instructions say to, "Think of an experience that has had an impact on you, that challenged you and about which you still have some questions and/or concerns." Now I have had any number of experiences that have impacted me and challenged me since my arrival here in Sept 2013, but I had to admit to the class that there were none about which I still had some questions and/or concerns. I am thankful for this, as it means that somehow as diverse as we are in our thinking, and with the challenges we have faced together, this congregation has been supportive and honest. Some people have come to me when they had concerns, particularly when I was doing or saying something they had questions about, and I pray this will continue. For those who do have questions and concerns, and you have not approached me I hope that you feel that, should you choose, you can speak with me. I have also said and believe, that I have the best Session in all of Canada! This considerate, dedicated, and faithful group have done much to help me lead in ministry. I give thanks for St. Andrew's and that my first few years in ministry have been some of the most extraordinary years of my life!
