


## The Book of Rose

Part two of the answer to the question, "What is the difference between Presbyterian's Sharing and Presbyterian World Service & Development (PWS&D)?" comes directly from a pamphlet produced by the Presbyterian Church in Canada (PCC) called *One Mission. Two Funds*. Last week, I looked at Presbyterian's Sharing which as I stated then refers to the PCC's national budget. Today we take a look at PWS&D which is the development and relief agency of the PCC.

"PWS&D raises funds directly from congregations and individuals and through government grants – over and above gifts to Presbyterians Sharing. Through PWS&D, our church responds internationally to promote food security, provide aid in times of conflict and disaster, improve health and nutrition for families, increase access to water and sanitation, promote education and economic empowerment, protect human rights and refugees. Together, we work with local partners overseas, as well as through membership in ecumenical organizations like Canadian Food grains Bank, ACT Alliance, and Canadian Churches in Action. Gifts to Presbyterians Sharing and PWS&D are sharing Christ's love in Canada and around the world!"
