Over the last year, there has been a devastating surge in the number of refugees searching for peace. After five years of bitter violence in Syria, millions of fearful residents have fled. Nisreen and Ahmad are two such people. "Our home used to be paradise," they lament, remembering a peaceful Syria. The couple found safety in Lebanon. but strugaled to afford food. Presbyterian World Service & Development is responding with Canadian Food grains Bank by providing food vouchers to refugees in Lebanon. The vouchers Nisreen and Ahmad received helped them purchase groceries and prepare home-cooked meals—restoring the sense of home they lost. On World Refugee Day, we pray that refugees from Syria and around the world will find safe haven.

From Rev. Joyce,

It is surprising what a day can bring. I am actually writing this Monday evening after another



extraordinary day in the life of the ministry of this church. I thought I would share with you what can happen on any given day, not every day is like this but there are enough of them that I no longer think of them as unique. Monday: had a conversation in the parking lot on the phone with a chaplain from Stony Mountain Penitentiary ending up with a serious invitation to come and check out the prison so I can get a glimpse into that life – clearance application is in my inbox; before the morning is up I end up in conversation with a young couple who would like to get married - they decide to come ask me if I would officiate at the wedding based on coming to worship at St. Andrew's at Christmas with friends, and they have been back since to check us out; afternoon involves visiting with a grieving mother and her daughter; a break for lunch then off to Pinewood Court to wish Harry a Happy 103rd birthday, met his daughter too; visit with another member of the congregation only to find out that someone I had lost track of since she was at St. Joe's and has moved into Pinewood. When I seek her out her first words are, "Oh vou found me!" followed up with a hug; as I leave the building I am able to touch base with another church family that happened to be leaving the building at the same time; home for supper then back to the church to meet with the couple about the wedding again - this time to make plans; amongst all of these encounters were other numerous phone calls to check in with people of our congregation, emails received. read and written, as well as. conversations with people at the church. Sadly, the last item on the list is to call the police late in the evening as I have concern for the welfare of those in the back lane – things were escalating.

This is a snapshot in the day in the life of St. Andrew's. I absolutely love this ministry! And I give thanks everyday that these experiences of and with people are the norm. It is absolutely incredible to see God at work in and through us, and with those I meet. My prayer is that regardless of your summer plans our ministry will be held in your prayers. God is at work here!
