

From Rev. Joyce,



Okay, I am going to do some thinking out loud. One of the things I have been thinking about a lot lately is all the people I encounter who are members of this church but we don't see regularly. They claim St. Andrew's as theirs. Most are on what we call "The Roll." Many I have spent time with during times of grieving, but also at times of celebration, sometimes over a cup of tea. I know that their faith is important to them, but the cares, work, and need for self-care (a day-off) often get in the way of attending worship. I also think that for many the thought of entering the doors of this church after months or years away must be very daunting. It may be that fear, apprehension, or possibly the concern that one might be judged, could be foremost in the minds of those who are even considering coming to church. Thoughts of "What will people say? Will I have to explain myself? Will I be welcomed? We I be accepted again?" all could be a factor, along with many other variables that lead to why people do not return to church after a long time away.

So I have a request, if you touch base with someone that you know has not been to church for a while, invite them back, let them know that we would rejoice in seeing them, *no questions asked!* If you see someone in church that has not been for a while, welcome them with love and joy. If you are reading this online or have received the newsletter from someone else, trust that we can't wait to see you! You are missed, you are loved, you are part of us. Welcome home.
