

PRESBYTERIAN SHARING

Determined to Rise Above Hunger

Witness Ngofi used to have no trouble harvesting enough food for her family in Malawi. But periods of erratic, unpredictable weather have made it increasingly difficult for her to protect her crops. When Witness heard that a Presbyterian World Service & Development-supported conservation agriculture program was starting in her village, she signed up right away. Conservation agriculture is a system of farming that helps revitalize the soil and increase yields. The process was challenging at first—the methods strayed from traditional farming and prompted discouraging remarks from other farmers. But despite having little rain, Witness's crop of maize was soon thriving. As her plot continued to flourish, she became a role model for other farmers determined to overcome hunger for the long-term.



From Rev. Joyce,



I was pondering how seasons in life overlap. Churches are just beginning their programs. Schools, universities, colleges, and tech schools are beginning a new year. Children are being born, while others are watching loved ones come to the end of life. I have family that is watching that happen at the same time.

Ken, my husband, a farmer at heart, was called on by his brother just over a week ago to see if he could come and help with harvest. Harvest is the end of the season for farmers and gardeners alike. And yes, he left for Alberta! I noticed from my backyard that trees in the area are just beginning to get tinges of gold. All of this goes on the world 'round; our summer is another's winter, our harvest just the starting of planting for some. In most parts of Canada, we experience the seasons also through the amount of daylight we get in a day. In the most extreme examples it is darkness for 24 hours in the winter and daylight for 24 hours in the summer.

We also experience seasons in our spiritual lives. One lifetime can hold many spiritual beginnings, or maybe awakenings might be a better word. There are seasons of darkness, when God seems very far away, though it is more likely that we are the ones pulling away from God, and there are seasons when the light is bright and our faith is strong. As a church it is our hope that we are able to meet people where they are at - in seasons of darkness, light, planting or harvest. May our community of faith reflect this openness in our work, worship, fellowship, and love.
