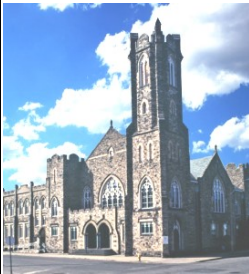

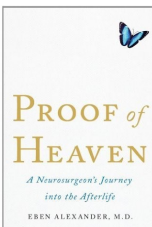


As Christians, we have been called to pray for each other in all circumstances. To help with this, we simply move through the church membership list. Today we ask that you hold the persons listed in your prayers:

## From Rev. Joyce,

Last week, as we began our journey through Lent, we focused on the sense of taste. Taste and see that the Lord is good was the phrase that echoed through the service. Today we continue "sensing the gospel" through sight. This one is tricky as each of us sees very differently. If you are like me you can see things close up, but far away all things are blurry. For example, when in grade six I received my first pair of glasses, that night I remember experiencing stars as they shone brightly and beautifully. I had only known stars as blobs of light up until that time. With the glasses I have now, I can see clearly far away, but I have to remove them to see close up. Usually I wear contacts that allow me to see clearly much of the time. It is very much like one's faith journey. At times we can clearly see God at work in our lives and that of others. Other times, it seems that God is pretty blurry. We can't make sense of what is going on around us and it seems as our sight of God has been diminished. Then there are the times when we can't see God at all – not in our lives, not in worship, not in others. Paul says in 1 Cor. 13:12 "Now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then we will see face to face. Now I know only in part; then I will know fully, even as I have been fully known" (NRSV). In scripture seeing and knowing are intertwined. In our lives God is not clear, we have to pay attention, we have to have spiritual eyes that are attentive to what God is up to. Yet it will not be until we are separated from this world and return to God that we will fully know God. God already knows us and see us clearly at all times. It is for us to continue to adjust the lens through which we see life. I encourage you to look for God in the coming days in the ordinary and the not so ordinary of your life and may our worship be a place where our eyes are opened, our lenses corrected, and our spiritual sight restored.
