





World Water Day (March 22)

Worldwide, 663 million people live without improved drinking water sources. A lack of clean water is a significant development challenge. In areas of the world where access to water is limited, local Presbyterian World Service & Development partners are responding to improve water sources, build new ones and train volunteers to maintain wells. Support to improve sanitation ensures water stays clean and prevents the spread of illness. PWS&D equips communities to build hand-washing facilities and latrines and educates members about proper hygiene. The results of this program are transformative and far reaching—clean water allows women and men to harvest crops, care for their families, expand their livelihoods and lead healthy, productive lives.

If you feel that someone in the congregation is a possible candidate for ordination to Eldership, please forward their name to Rev. Joyce or the Clerk of Session, John Mason. Nominations must be signed by the individual(s) making the nomination. *Sealed* nominations may be left with the secretary. There is no formal nomination form. This is an important part of how the Presbyterian Church in Canada functions. Remember this is a term commitment, not for life. Please take seriously the whispering that God may be placing on your heart about eldership, for yourself or another.

From Rev. Joyce,

This coming weekend our church is hosting a Presbytery-wide Elder's retreat. Many of you will be familiar with the role of Elders in our church, but I remember when I first attended the Presbyterian Church in a community close to my home town, I had no idea what an elder was, and what this thing was they kept referring to as a session. Though the role of Elder has many facets, let me just share a few things that may be helpful. The following comments come from a pamphlet entitled, *Becoming an elder in the Presbyterian Church in Canada*.



Any person who is a member of the church and who seeks to grow in Christian faith might be a suitable elder. An elder is not expected to be perfect, to have an unswerving faith, to have all the answers, or to be elderly in age! An elder receives training, learns from other elders, and grows as a Christian in the role. Being an elder is a spiritual calling that can be challenging, interesting, and fulfilling. It is an experience of ongoing learning and faith development and service. Elders use their God-given gifts to serve and strengthen God's church, helping to lead it forward in its mission to announce the good news to the world.

If you feel God is calling you to the role of Elder in our congregation, or you can think of someone that you feel may be a good candidate for this role, please contact me in the next few days. The retreat will be a wonderful opportunity for people considering eldership to explore and ask questions.
