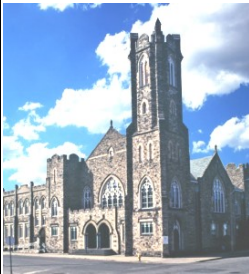

World Health Day (April 7)

"I was happy and relieved that my disease was diagnosed and that it was curable!" The gratitude Sher felt after getting answers to his health concerns and medicine to treat his leprosy is inspiring. But the road to recovery had an uncertain start. In an effort to heal a mysterious lesion on his foot, Sher tried a variety of herbal remedies. But the wound continued to fester. "I was in distress. I knew something was wrong." Sher was referred to a Presbyterian World Service & Development-supported clinic in Nepal where he was finally diagnosed. Though anxious at first, health workers comforted Sher and explained his treatment options. Now cured—and equipped with the knowledge and support to build a healthy future—Sher has peace of mind.

It seems that we just began our series on Sensing the Gospel and now we are on the final Sunday in Lent. Next week we begin what is called Passion Week. If you have never attended some of these services you might choose to do so this year as a way of experiencing the story of Christ's life, death, and resurrection with a renewed sense and appreciation for the mystery of our faith and wonder of the story. Palm Sunday, with its joyous opening, turns to give us a foretaste of the coming week, leading us into Maundy Thursday, an opportunity for experiencing an evening service in the sanctuary with communion. Good Friday gives an impression of the stark truth of the death of Jesus. These services prepare us to really begin to grasp the amazing gift of life and the exuberance of our faith on Easter Sunday, which we celebrate with joy and hope. Take this week to listen for God's direction and you may find an urging to hear God's story through the gift of worship during the Passion Week.
