


There will be a "mix and mingle" get together of the Ontario Genealogical Society on Tues May 30th from 7-9pm at the Mary JL

Razia always wanted to be a mother. But the young woman had struggled for years to conceive and feared something was wrong. In the remote village in Afghanistan where she lives, the closest health centre was a distance away; therefore St. Andrew's Sunday Services will be medical check-ups and tests seemed a nuisance and the cost to travel an unnecessary expense. With the establishment of a Presbyterian World on that day and will continue for the Service & Development-supported health centre in a nearby village, Razia was able to meet with medical professionals who addressed her health concerns and helped her receive proper treatment so she could get pregnant. Today, with improved


access to necessary health services, Razia's well-being has improved and her hope is restored.





From Rev. Joyce,


