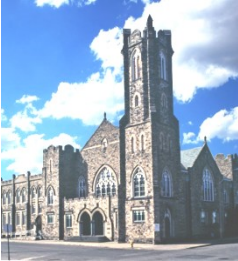

World Food Day (October 16)

Today, 800 million people worldwide go to bed with an empty stomach. The majority of the world's hungry people are subsistence farmers. These farmers struggle to cultivate plentiful harvests in the midst of a changing climate, which brings unpredictable and extreme weather events that devastate crops. The Canadian Foodgrains Bank's Climate Fund is a way for Canadians to respond to families impacted by climate change. This year, donations to the Climate Fund will support PWS&D's agro-ecological and food security project in Guatemala. The project has been transformative for Catalina, a farmer who received support to adapt to climate change, grow more vegetables and improve her family's nutrition. "I am grateful that we can see another way to live a healthy life," she says.

Christ Alone. It is by grace alone we have been saved through faith alone, in Christ alone. It is grace. The grace of God is only spoken of in the Christian faith. To experience grace one must have faith, both gifts of God. We place our faith in God who loves us so much more than we could ever imagine, that he sent the Son, Jesus Christ so that we could have a personal relationship with the one who created us. For some this is one of the most difficult things to understand. How can one man have made such a difference? The Gospels in particular are the Good News of Jesus Christ. Jesus was fully human and fully divine. He was unique in the world and yet lived in the world. He was before the world and continues to reign with God. He is Christ Alone! And through faith we experience his grace, God's grace. Thanks be to God for compassion, love, forgiveness, and these exquisite gifts.
