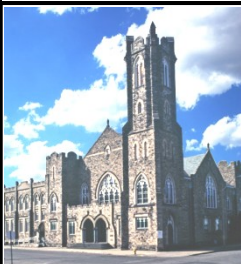

Presbyterians Sharing supports the Rev. Dr. Paul McLean, a Bible translation consultant working in partnership with The Presbyterian Church in Taiwan and The Bible Society in Taiwan. In a recent blog post, Paul writes: "Maelaanenge ki Twaumase!" (Thanks be to God!) These words were repeated during the joyful 3-hour thanksgiving service for the publication of the Ngudradrekai Bible on July 11, 2017 at Kucapungane Presbyterian Church in the mountain foothills of southern Taiwan. Nearly 30 years after The Gospel first took root in Old Kucapungane village, Ngudradrekai people now have the complete Bible printed in their own mother language." The Rev Peter Bush, Moderator of the 2017 General Assembly, attended the celebration. He shares, "To read the Bible in one's mother language is to be affirmed culturally as a people having value and it is to be called to discipleship following Jesus Christ."

From Rev. Joyce,

The Bible. Most of us, who attend church and call ourselves Christian, have at least one Bible in our home. We take for granted that we can have this, so much so that often the Bible is never opened. We have lost the wonder of the word. In the time of the Reformation people didn't own Bibles. The invention of the printing press allowed the Bible to be the first book to ever be mass produced. This was incredible! The word of God in the hands of the people, not just in the hands of clergy. It meant that for the first time the general population could learn and interpret God's promises for themselves. It did not mean that the learning of the scholars was unimportant, but it meant that the people could also think for themselves, ponder the scriptures, and see the Holy Spirit at work in making the word come alive in their lives. Bible translation continues to be an important work in the world where some are only in now getting to read the words of scripture in their mother tongue. May God grant us the blessing of reading the words of scripture with hearts and minds open to the wonder, mystery, grace and love.
