

## AUTOMATIC EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATOR

## A FINANCIAL UPDATE

We are now 8% of the way through 2018 ... already! Our Presbyterian Sharing donations as of January 31st are close to this amount at 7.5% - a difference of \$143. Funds raised to support this Church are lagging behind at 5.5%.



Our insurance fees for St. Andrew’s in 2018 was \$9,471 which we paid in January.

With the change in our heating system, we are pleased to announce a savings in January on our heating bill of 27% compared to January 2017.

Thank you to those who gave donations in the Initial Offering envelopes to offset the cost of envelopes. To date we have received \$326. The cost for providing envelopes for 2018 is \$694.

*From Rev. Joyce,*

What does Lent mean to you? To some it is nothing more than the name given to a season in the church. For others, they are busy trying to figure out if they should give up chocolate, swearing, or bacon. Others try to instill a new practice into their lives for a time; meditation, prayer, making a concerted effort to connect with others on a daily basis. So for some it is an inert time, others a time of denying themselves, and for others a time to grow a new discipline. There is no right way to do Lent, but it is an opportunity to reflect on what it means to be a follower of Jesus and wonder about the mystery of our faith. We are a people who believe in this person who we understand to be both fully human and fully divine. One who was willing to give up his own life - was the only one who could give up his own life - so that we could have a relationship with God that would not have been possible without his death, resurrection and ascension. Coming to an understanding of our faith, being able to live with the paradoxes, the mysteries, and what we know for sure, takes courage and time. May the coming weeks of Lent be an opportunity to ask questions, ponder, wonder, worship, and deepen our walk with God.
