We are now 8% of the way through 2018 ... already! Our Presbyterian Sharing donations as of

Our insurance fees for St. Andrew's in 2018 was \$9,471 which we paid in January. With the change in our heating system, we are pleased to announce a savings in January on our heating bill of 27% compared to January 2017. Thank you to those who gave donations in the Initial Offering envelopes to offset the cost of envelopes. To date we have received \$326. The cost for providing envelopes for 2018 is \$694.
