

Joyce, When it comes to the content of worship there are different approaches that can be taken. Regardless of how one might choose to do that, scripture is central. In the Presbyterian Church in Canada the minister has oversight of worship and, following the pattern of the majority of Presbyterian Churches, most often at St. Andrew's we follow what is called the Revised Common Lectionary (RCL). However, it can be interesting and edifying to focus on a theme for a time that takes us away from the pattern of the RCL, this will be the case for the Lenten services. Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on February 14 th and marks the start of midweek services at St. Andrew's. This year's focus for mid-week services will be the Book of Habakkuk. If you plan to attend these services you might find it interesting to read this Old Testament Book of the minor prophet Habakkuk. <i>Let <u>All</u> of Me Kneel before God's Holy Name</i> , will be the theme for Sunday worship throughout Lent and on Palm Sunday.
