

Smiling again

Pursottam was driving his bus when he experienced a sudden, agonizing pain in his hand. The ache spread through his body and became so intense that he struggled to finish his route. When the pain did not relent, Pursottam spent his savings traveling to visit neurologists, but no doctor could provide a diagnosis. Meanwhile, Pursottam grew frightened and anxious about his ability to continue working. His prayers were answered the day he heard about the PWS&D-supported hospital in the remote Banke district in Nepal. There he was diagnosed with leprosy and given effective medicine. Today, Pursottam's health has been restored. "I am so happy to see him smile again," shares Pursottam's brother. "We finally found relief here at the Banke Hospital."

STEWARDSHIP

The bible teaches us that everything we have is a gift from God, and has been entrusted to our care. As stewards of God's gifts, we are accountable to God for what we do with these gifts. Stewardship has to do with the responsible use of all life, including our natural resources, our bodies, our time, talents and financial resources. We are not owners, but stewards, of what God has entrusted to us. Financial stewardship is only one area of stewardship, but a very important one. So what does it mean to be a good steward of our financial resources? In order to help us answer this question, the Presbyterian Church has developed some guidelines for giving.

1. Giving is a symbolic act of worship, which expresses the giving of your whole self to Jesus and his teachings.
 2. Give because God loves you, not to earn God's approval.
 3. Give intentionally and of your own free will.
 4. Give the "first fruits", not the leftovers of your income.
 5. Give regularly.
 6. Give cheerfully.
 7. Give proportionally, a percentage of your income, according to what you have been given.
- We are stewards of this beautiful building and of the ministry carried out by St Andrew's. It exists because of our financial stewardship.

A FINANCIAL UPDATE

February is 17% of the way through the year. The funds raised to date should be close to that amount. We are very happy to report that Presbyterian Sharing is currently at 21%; however, funds raised to support our church continue to fall behind and is currently at 12%.

Our new heating system continues to save us money on our heating bill. In February we had a much colder month than last year and we still had a savings of 32% compared to February 2017.

From Rev. Joyce,

This past weekend Elders from the Presbytery of Superior met together at St. Andrew's to learn about the *Role of Elders in Congregational Change: The Challenges and Opportunities*. Our workshop leader was Rev. Dr. Dales Woods, Principal at Presbyterian College, in Montreal. Dr. Woods came to Presbyterian College in 2008 as Director of Pastoral Studies after almost fourteen years as senior minister at First Presbyterian Church, Brandon. In 2005 he completed his Doctor of Ministry from Luther Seminary in St. Paul, Minnesota. His main focus has been in the area of congregational change and revitalization. He was named Principal in 2014. Dr. Woods' leadership at the workshop was an occasion for Elders of St. Andrew's Geraldton, Lakeview Presbyterian, First Presbyterian, and our own St. Andrew's to explore and discuss our church and ministry contexts. The Friday evening and Saturday workshop also allowed Elders of the various churches to reconnect, get to know one another, and support each other in our roles as leaders called to a specific task and work within the church. Elders take seriously their call from God and the congregation to lead God's people. I give thanks for their willingness to take time to be present for this learning opportunity. Please hold your elders in prayer on a regular basis.
