



St. Andrew's stories are important to hear. God always seems to be at work. I want to share a Good Friday story with you. For that service, a number of items were needed to be placed on the communion table as scripture was read. Each item represented something either from Psalm 23 or from the Good Friday passion story. Ken being my right-hand prop finder/maker on many occasions, was once again put to work helping create and find what was needed. One of the items we required was a fairly large rock to represent the stone that would have sealed the tomb of Jesus. As it happened, Ken was passing by Lempiala Sand & Gravel everyday on his way to a job site. So he stopped in one day to see if they would allow him to get a rock. He went to the scale house and from there was sent over to the maintenance garage. It was lunch time so a number of guys around happened to be in that building. He let them know that he was after a rock for a church service. Ken was thinking he would have to wait until they were done lunch, but right away the foreman asked the loader operator to take Ken over to one of the large stock piles. But they didn't just walk over, the operator took the loader so that they could dig and find the perfect rock. Ken found just what we needed on the outside of the pile, but the operator was willing to do more to get the perfect rock.
