PWS&D MISSION MOMENT World Food Day (Oct. 16)

Hunger finds families when they are facing challenges like poverty, conflict, climate change and illness. Globally, hunger burdens over 800 million people-Rosa Martinez from Nicaragua was one of them. The effects of climate change made it difficult for Rosa to predict when to plant her crops. When she did, irregular rainfall ruined what little food she'd grown. Through a sustainable agriculture project supported by Canadian Foodgrains Bank, PWS&D helped Rosa learn to store water, grow new plant varieties and start seedlings in cups for better plant growth. Because of what she's learned, Rosa is growing more food for her family. A sustainable source of food opens the door to abundant life. PWS&D is working for zero hunger

From Rev. Joyce...

As I write this I am preparing to head out with Elder Susan Dynes to a 24-hour. Synod of Manitoba and the Northwest Conference/Retreat in Gimli Manitoba. I have to say, other than knowing from a conference schedule that our facilitator is a man by the name of Darren Hall. I have no idea what this will be about. I know that sounds a little crazy, but I really have not had time to research or inquire and all I know is that from noon on Tuesday to noon on Wednesday (Oct 16/17) Susan and I will be given an opportunity to be with twenty other participants from Presbyteries with in the bounds of the Synod. Three presbyteries make up the Synod and are our own - the Presbytery of Superior, as well as the Presbytery of Winnipeg, and the Presbytery of Brandon. What I do know is that the retreat comes out of a desire to have the broader church strengthen bonds, come to know a little more about who we are in different parts of the church, our challenges, our concerns, and our joys. It is an opportunity for learning and getting to know one another – for building relationships. Part of the beauty of the Presbyterian Church is that we are part of something bigger than just who we are at St. Andrew's Thunder Bay or even the five churches that make up the Presbytery of Superior. It will be a time of group and personal reflection, trusting that God is with us, and maybe time to walk along the shores of Lake Winnipeg enjoying God's creation.
