

This Casavant Pipe Organ was originally installed in 1909 and rebuilt in 1929 to change from Tubular Pneumatic to electro-pneumatic, add trombone, and add a roll-top console case. Recognized in 2006 it is a historical instrument worthy of citation, now in need of maintenance to make sure it continues for another 100 years. PWS&D MISSION MOMENT World Soil Day (Dec. 5)

Soil gives life and supports livelihoods around the world. In Badin, Pakistan, Rabia's life depends on access to rich, fertile soil—she needs it to grow the crops she sells each week at the market. But an especially dry summer has led to severe water shortages in her village. Rabia's soil was too arid to yield the produce she needs. With support from PWS&D and Canadian Foodgrains Bank, Rabia has learned to adopt agricultural practices that use less water. She also received seeds to grow crops that can survive extended dry periods. "This is

highly beneficial for farmers like me, who reside in water-scarce areas," shares Rabia.

May these readings and our worship prepare your heart, mind, and body for the wonder of the Christmas message.

The Candle of Hope

Good Christian friends, rejoice with heart and soul and voice. Jesus Christ was born today! Christ was born for this! Christ was born to save! As this lively carol reminds us, Christmas should be the most joyous season of the year for Christians. Our lives should be filled with gratitude to God for the immeasurable love shown to us in the gift of his Son. Out of joyous hearts we should be exuberant in "heart and soul and voice!" The festive spirit of Christmas, however, should not fade away as the holiday passes. The joy and peace that Christ brings to our lives should enable us to be continually rejoicing Christians regardless of the circumstances.
