Please pray. As I write this note on a Wednesday morning. I have been inundated by the need of the people on the street. Yesterday morning was not much different. I came in at 9:00am to get to the projects on my desk and now at 10:30 and I am just now sitting down to the first piece on my list. It is not to say that other things have not taken up my time. I am preparing for a funeral that seems to be taking some amount of coordination as well. Still as I came to the door to speak with people who were looking for "bus fare" there seemed to be an inordinate number of people mulling about on Brodie Street. When I speak with them, they have no other purpose but to survive the day as best they can, to find whatever resources they can, including coming to the church. I am not bothered by the fact that people come to the church to see if we can help, I am more saddened that we do not have the resources for the need or the want. I am not even sure what God is calling this congregation to do. I know that Jesus had a heart for those who were on the margins. I know it is really difficult for us to find our way to knowing what God is asking of us, but I really believe that until our church becomes a church that prays, with many individuals praying daily for this congregation and our purpose that goes beyond ourselves, we may be like a ship without a rudder. So please pray. Pray for our congregation, pray for those who have not found their purpose in life, and are lost. Pray that we may be God's hands and feet and heart here on Brodie Street.
