Envisioning malaria-free communities

In Thimalala village in Malawi, Jimmy Gondwe was not sleeping well. He was concerned about the mosquitoes inside his home, fearing they carried the deadly malaria virus. While malaria rates have gone down in Malawi, it remains a significant health challenge, especially among pregnant women and children. Malaria-carrying mosquitoes mostly bite at night, with more than 80 per cent of transmission occurring indoors. To help ensure more households stay healthy and malaria-free, a Presbyterian World Service & Development project is helping to safely treat homes with insecticide. Jimmy reports that since the project, he feels safer inside his home—a now mosquito-free environment. "I am grateful for the support," Jimmy said. PWS&D envisions malaria-free communities

From Rev. Joyce

Today I am leading worship at St. Andrew's Seraldton. It is anticipated that this will be the last Sunday worship service I do in that church not with the congregation – but in that particular building. If all things go as planned the building will be sold by the end of June. St. Andrew's Presbyterian and St. James Anglican have been working and worshiping together over the last six years. For five of those years I have been observing and working with them as they have built relationships and trust. They have come to know that they are much stronger together than they were apart and share worship every Sunday. The first and third Sundays are typically at St. James in an Anglican style of worship and the second and fourth Sundays the congregation is at the Presbyterian Church. Last year they decided to put both churches up for sale and see which one might sell. It didn't take long for another congregation in the community that was looking for a better building to make an offer and they chose St. Andrew's. I know the Anglian congregation breathed a sigh of relief, but St. Andrew's had become home for all of them and there will be a time of grieving for all. Still, the congregations are really pleased that the building will continue as a church. They have also shown me how well two can become one. A working group and the congregations are preparing a shared ministry agreement that, once approved by both denominations, will become the basis of their new covenant with one another. They will continue to worship as they have, but in one building. Please hold them all in prayer, but particularly the St. Andrew's community of faith, as they say goodbye to their beloved building over the coming weeks.
