

St. Andrew's Day is November 30, so as promised here is a little bit more on the saint our church was named after. For the first article, you can refer back to the November 3rd newsletter note.

St. Andrew's Day is a feast day in honour of this apostle. St. Andrew is the patron saint not only of Scotland, but also of Cyprus, Greece, Romania, Russia, and the Ukraine. On all Saints Sunday at the beginning of November during the children's time I pointed out that the stained-glass window on the main sanctuary floor (North West corner) was entitled, *St. Andrew's and the Loaves and Fishes*. Here, "glass and leadlines ae patterned by the artist in rays that seem like heavenly light, indicating the bestowal of God's grace and the occurrence of a miracle. St. Andrew's symbol, the diagonal or saltire cross, can be seen above his head. The Chi-Rho symbol for Christ is a reminder of His divine presence in the miracle."

There is a second stained glass window in the sanctuary that also portrays St. Andrew. It is at the back main floor of the sanctuary or entrance wall. If you face the wall it is the stained-glass to your right. It is named, *Christ Calling the Disciples*, St. Andrew is the one in green. "The colours are of sunlit sky, sea and shore." These descriptions are taken from the pamphlet, *Windows of St. Andrew's*. There are copies in the front office if you are interested in learning more about our stunning and beautifully crafted windows.
