

WHITE GIFT SUNDAY Dec. 8, 2019

The tradition of White Gift Sunday has its roots in a small Methodist church in Ohio in 1904. The story is told that a minister's wife initiated the idea to solve the problem of inequity of gifts given at the Sunday school Christmas party. Instead of focusing on receiving gifts, the focus shifted to bringing gifts to Jesus that could in turn be shared with people around the world who did not have much. All the gifts would come wrapped in plain white paper, so that no one would know which was an expensive gift and which was a more modest one. No one would feel ashamed of their gift and everyone would share in the joy of giving to others. In keeping with the spirit of the first White Gift service, donations will be accepted and then brought to the Thunder Bay Food Bank.

ORGAN UPDATE

First of all, thank you! Thank you to those who were able to give above and beyond their regular offerings to help raise the funds to do the extensive maintenance that was needed to keep St. Andrew's historic organ in excellent condition. It was a wonderful day when Connor let the organ open up on the last hymn so that we could hear the magnificent sound. We had fundraised just over \$20,000 for the work as per the quote given by Dodington & Dodington of Toronto. This company has done the regular maintenance on this organ and others in the city for a long number of years. The plan was to have the work done this past summer. That work was delayed until September, which meant that other organs in the city would be tuned a little ahead of the normal October schedule. This worked to our advantage as the cost of travel was split between all the congregations who used Dodington's services. Our bill came to a \$15,181.55. We saved a full \$4,000.00 off the original quote. Though there may be challenges St. Andrew's faces in the coming months and year in regards to our building that change this position, Session's hope is to leave this money set aside for future tuning and maintenance of the organ. Once again, thank you for your generosity.

Sheila was just a few months old when her mother died, and she went to live with her grandmother, Elube, in Malawi. Two years later, Sheila's health began to sharply decline. Elube brought her granddaughter to the PWS&D-supported Mulanje Mission Hospital where Sheila was diagnosed as HIV positive and acutely malnourished. Elube's grief weighed a little less heavily when she learned that Sheila could receive treatment at a nearby orphan care centre. Supported by PWS&D, these centres provide vulnerable children with free medical care, school support and nutrition assistance. With a place to receive antiretroviral treatment and highly nutritious food, Sheila's



health is improving and Elube is better equipped to meet her granddaughter's needs.

There are different ways that people count the days to Christmas. Many use a chocolate Advent calendar with its little windows to help children do their countdown to Christmas morning. I noticed

in the last couple of years that some candy/ chocolate companies are upscaling their Advent calendars to appeal to adults. When my children were little, I bought this wonderful hand made Advent calendar with twenty-five pockets that I could fill with different things. Besides a candy or chocolate for each child I would have a slip of paper that had suggestions of how we could do things for others, like make a phone call to Grandma, or do something good for a classmate. Another way to count down to Christmas is to use the Jesse Tree.

The Jesse Tree began in Medieval times as a pictorial way to teach about Jesus' lineage starting from creation. It is called the Jesse Tree based on Isaiah 11:1, "A shoot shall come out from the stock of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots." (NRSV) We will have a Jesse Tree in the sanctuary this Christmas along with our Christmas Tree. Jamie Gerow has designed the Jesse Tree. In the coming weeks the children's story will cover the different symbols of the Jesse Tree with a brief story telling about each ornament. Each ornament has

been crafted by Jamie as well.
Thank you, Jamie! Each Sunday
the worship service will take one of
the scriptures as the basis for the
symbol, hymns, and sermon. My
hope is that you find yourself
thinking of the birth of Christ from a
different perspective as you count
the days to Christmas morning.
