

We continue our countdown to Christmas morning by adding ornaments to the Jesse Tree. The Jesse Tree began in Medieval times as a pictorial way to teach about Jesus' lineage starting from creation. Following is the list of ornaments and their meaning in order of the ornament, what it symbolizes and the scripture reference.
