A PCC MISSION MOMENT **Restoration and Rehabilitation** After Cyclone Idai

In Malawi, eating raw maize, a grain usually dried to make the traditional food nsima, is a sign of pressing hunger. After Cyclone Idai stormed into Malawi, Mozambigue and Zimbabwe one year ago, many people were left with only this option-or worse, with no food at all. After the cyclone, Katherine Chiphwayna's lost crops meant her family of four often went to bed hungry. Then Katherine began receiving support through PWS&D and Canadian Foodgrains Bank. She is now able to work more and provide her children with fish, eggplants and tomatoes, in addition to the nsima they like. "The kids are happy to eat the

food. It's very tasty."
