From Joyce

The Presbytery of Superior met at St. Andrew's this past Friday, so I thought it might be interesting for you to know a little about this presbytery and its function. A presbytery is most often the grouping of churches in a particular region. There are forty-five presbyteries in Canada. Our particular presbytery is very small at only four congregations represented, St. Andrew's, First Presbyterian, Lakeview, and St. Andrew's Presbyterian and St. James Anglican Shared Ministry in Geraldton.

The PCC website provides the following information, "The constituent roll of each presbytery is made up of ministers and elders from each congregation within its bounds—one elder for each minister on the constituent roll. Retired ministers and ministers without a pastoral charge are placed on the appendix to the constituent roll. Presbyteries support and oversee their congregations and ministers. While scheduling varies according to geography and need, presbyteries normally meet several times each year. The moderator may be a minister or an elder."

Though ideally, there would be one minister representative and one elder representative from each church, in our presbytery's case there are only two ministers in congregational ministry, myself and Rev. Markus Arseneault, and so that balance is not there. But having the balance weigh more heavily with ruling elders is preferable. Minsters are referred to as teaching elders, and people elected by their congregation and approved by a session to be admitted to the session are called ruling elders.

When a congregation does not have a minister, the presbytery appoints an interim moderator, who must be an ordained minister. This person can be in active ministry whether congregational or otherwise, or a retired minister. I have been the interim moderator for the congregation in Geraldton basically since my arrival in Thunder Bay being appointed there in January 2014. In March 2021, I was appointed interim moderator at First Presbyterian as well. Of course, this work takes some time away from the ministry at St. Andrew's. As we are the church, are called to care for one another, through my work with these congregations and the presbytery, we are able to show compassion, care, and support for our sister congregations in the Presbytery.

As part of the ministry of a presbytery in caring for congregations, there are times when presbytery representatives visit congregations to see if there are any concerns or ways that support might be given. There are plans for congregational visits to happen over the next year or so as this is a piece of the Presbytery's work that needs attention. It can be a wonderful opportunity to share our congregation's work and worship as well as bring to the attention of the presbytery ways that it may be able to support congregations. The Presbytery does much administrative work, but its function is to provide care and provision for congregations and support to ministers who are called to serve.
