## From Rev. Joyce

Can you just put yourself in that moment? Your little group of friends and family are headed to the gravesite. Even though dead, you want to spend just a little time as close to the one you loved as possible. As you approach the site you realize that something is terribly wrong. Someone has vandalized the spot! Fearing the worst possible outcome, you rush over to the site. No it can't be! How could this happen?!. How could someone be so cruel as to disrespect this final resting spot in such a way? Some of the group return home in disbelief, but you, you can't leave. Weeping over the loss, not once but twice, having to grieve the unbelievable. How could all this be happening after all that has been experienced these past three years? How can this now take place after everything that has gone on these last three days?

But then another moment of disbelief and fear. Angels! Angels come to reassure that the one that you loved has not been taken. The grave has not been robbed. But death has been robbed! You turn around, and then a familiar voice. Your Jesus stands there facing you. This is no ordinary day. This is a day that will be celebrated for more than two thousand years around the world.

We cannot explain the mystery of Christ's resurrection, but we know from all Christ said and did that it happened for us. He predicted it. He said after three days in the grave he would once again live and because of that, those who believe will never experience separation from God in life or in death. When John wrote his letter he said, "Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name. (John 20:30-31)

May you know this Easter day, this resurrection morning, and each day of your life the saving grace of Jesus Christ and God's unimaginable and unending love for you through the power of the Holy Spirit!
