From Rev. Joyce:



As many of you are aware St. Andrew's and First-Wesley United Church have signed a Memorandum of Agreement regarding sharing summer worship. I have had a number of questions about this, so I present the following summary.

The Session of St. Andrew's approached the Board of First Wesley to see if they would like to partner for summer worship services with one church taking the services in July and the other in August. There is a history from years back, in which this happened each summer, and after having First Wesley with us last August there was renewed interest in

experiencing this partnership again.

So after discussion and planning, it has been agreed that for the month of July worship services will be held jointly at First-Wesley with our congregation heading over there. St. Andrew's will not hold services in July at our church. In August it will flip and we will host the joint worship services here at St. Andrew's with First-Wesley's congregation coming here for worship. Rev. Hewitt and I will both be leading worship services throughout the summer and in each congregation. We were given the prerogative to choose how we will accomplish this. As St. Andrew's has always changed our summer worship time, in mid June we will do the same, with the time for worship being 10:30 a.m.

It is the prayer of Session and myself along with the Board of First-Wesley and Hewitt that this be a time of wonderful ecumenical partnership and Christian fellowship.
