

### From Rev. Joyce,

Today is known as Reformation 4 Sunday. Below is a really good excerpt taken the History from Channel regarding the Augustinian monk Martin Luther (1483-1546). If it peaks your interest, you can check out more at http:// www.history.com/topics/martin-luther-and-the-95theses or check out your local library for books regarding Luther and the Reformation. Our Presbyterian theology is what it is in part because of this man's willingness to question the practices of the church in his own time. God created us with minds to ponder and to question. May we in the spirit of Martin Luther always be willing to ask questions and seek deeper understanding.

"Committed to the idea that salvation could be reached through faith and by divine grace only, Luther vigorously objected to the corrupt practice of selling indulgences. Acting on this belief, he wrote the "Disputation on the Power and Efficacy of Indulgences," also known as "The 95 Theses," a list of questions and propositions for debate. Popular legend has it that on October 31, 1517 Luther defiantly nailed a copy of his 95 Theses to the door of the Wittenberg Castle church. The reality was probably not so dramatic; Luther more likely hung the document on the door of the church matter-of-factly to announce the ensuing academic discussion around it that he was organizing. The 95 Theses... would later become the foundation of the Protestant Reformation..."
