Annie Nguluve was amazed by the results of the program. Since learning about the advantages of intercropping, her small plot of land

STEWARDSHIP MOMENTS

From Rev. Joyce,

I have a new appreciation for grief. It was not until my mom's death that I had ever lost someone close to me that I loved for so long and so much. When I got back from the funeral in early December I thought to myself,



"Okay, get through Christmas, enjoy the visit with my daughter, son-in-law, and granddaughter, then back to business." That worked for about two weeks in January. This past week the grief hit me hard. I have cried out as many tears again as I did in those first few weeks. As much as I have walked alongside those who are grieving, particularly in the first few days after someone's death, it is the depth of the loss and its continued pull on my energy and spirit that has surprised me. My mom lived a good long life, our family was loving, and she was a Christian. Everything in my head says its good, but the rest of my body is saying, not really. Mom is fine, its me who is missing that person with whom I could share all the stuff that no one else wanted to listen to. I miss her smile, her touch, her phone calls, and though I told her I loved her many times, I still have regrets and questions.

Through observing my own family, I have also learned how differently each person experiences loss and that no one way is the right way. Grief brings with it many emotions and challenges. With all of my training, being with people, and faith, I could not have anticipated what my own grief was going to be like. For those of you who grieve, I pray you will know God gives us strength enough for each day, and when the strength is not there it may be time to rest from your labours, whether a few hours or days, and be renewed. If needed, find someone to be with you in it. Know that I am there for you, and now I get it even more than I did before.
