From Rev. Joyce,

Come and See! For whatever reason one of the toughest things to do is invite family and friends to come and see, come check out the church and worship. As it turns out, the only way churches grow is by



invitation. Yes, some churches have programs, but the basic point, even of programs specifically targeted at bringing people into church, is that people need an invitation. Yet some studies suggest that anywhere from 85-90 % of people sitting in the pews have no intention of ever inviting someone to church.

How can it be that something that we find life-giving and so important to our own well being is also something we don't share? If you tasted really good food at a restaurant you would be sure to share that experience with family and friends, even inviting them to go with you some time. In fact, you might even offer to pick them up. But when it comes to church and being fed really good spiritual food through word and music, we don't say a word to others outside of the church.

The one thing that brings people into church is an invitation, the one thing that keeps us from inviting is fear. Fear of rejection, fear of messing up a relationship, fear of not having the right words to say, the list goes on and on of things that we fear when inviting people to Church. The one other thing that I have found as truth is often my greatest fears are unrealized. I read a quote many years ago, that read, there can be no courage without fear.

So my invitation to you is push past the fear and invite others to come and see. You don't need to set up any expectations or explain yourself. Just share with them as you might in a conversation about a good restaurant, invite others to Come and See!
