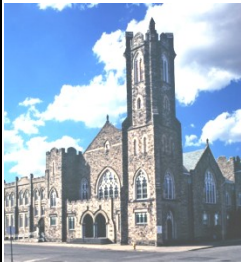

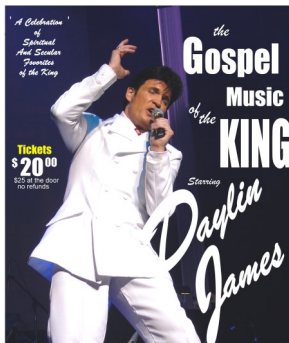

## From Rev. Joyce,



As I shared last week, I am having to review the Book of Forms, as it is called in the Presbyterian Church, to be sure that the Session and I are following the ordinances of the church as we proceed with profession of faith classes and an upcoming elder election. Last week I wrote about "professing members." The following quotes comes from the section heading Membership and Pastoral Care.

110. The session is responsible for seeking out, preparing and admitting persons as professing members, and for the pastoral care of all persons within the fellowship of the congregation.

110.1 The session is responsible for the provision of instruction in the Christian faith of applicants for professing membership.

Most often to fulfill this responsibility, people are invited to consider whether or not they would like to become professing members of the congregation. Sometimes families or individuals will express and interest at their own initiative which is also welcomed. Sessions and ministers will accomplish the task of provision of instruction in various ways, there is no standard course of instruction. Here at St. Andrews' we hold eight sessions of instruction of 1½ hours each. The studies include an overview of the Bible and learning how to use it, discussion of the Trinity, learning about the elements of worship, with the students helping to plan and participate in a Sunday service of worship, and of course learning about the Apostles' Creed, Baptism and Communion.

All of this is some of my most enjoyable work in the church. It is a opportunity to dig deeper into my own understanding and journey of faith as I work with others, attentive to their questions and discovery.
