PRESBYTERIAN SHARING Hope lives here!

Presbyterians Sharing helps Toronto's ARISE Ministry offer outreach, case management and pastoral care to victims of human trafficking and people involved in the sex trade. As part of this ministry, the Rev. Deb Rapport sets out once a week at midnight with one or two others to chat with women they meet and find out if they are ok. They hand out bags filled by volunteers with things a woman might want - including hand sanitizer. tissues, lip gloss, chocolate and emergency numbers - and even more important, a sign that someone cares. Deb shares, "ARISE Ministry is where hope lives! What a profoundly awe-inspiring experience to see hope take hold in someone's life. Please pray for ARISE as we

continue to plant, tend and care for the seeds of hope growing in the lives of individuals involved in the sex trade."



Presbyterians Sharing shines a light in the darkness

One more week on Section 110.2 of 绪 the Book of Form. Here is the last sentence from that section.

The session may not require assent doctrine to any or special qualifications beyond this profession of faith so described and further expressed in the Apostles Creed.

The Apostle's Creed. We say it most often when we have a baptism or profession of faith, but it rightly fits into any service of worship. You can find it as Hymn #539 in the Book of Praise, which is the hymn book of the Presbyterian Church in Canada. Here is the PCC's way of describing this important doctrine of the worldwide church:

"The word "creed" comes from the Latin word credo, meaning "I believe." The first Christians professed the simple creed, "Jesus is Lord." With the death of witnesses to Jesus' life, death, and resurrection, many questions arose regarding God, Jesus, and the Christian life. These questions led to several centuries of intense debate, meetings of church councils, and the writing of many creeds, including the Nicene Creed and the Apostles' Creed. (Despite its name, the Apostles' Creed was actually a statement of faith developed over several centuries in Rome to teach new Christians the basic beliefs of the church. The text we use today can be traced back to the late 7th century.)" http://presbyterian.ca/about/more/

This important Creed continues to be the most succinct and poetic way for us to express a basic understanding of what it means to be a Christian.
