

ABOUT THE WINDOWS OF ST. ANDREW'S

Stained glass windows enhance the beauty of the church, depicting The Good Shepherd, the Dove with the Olive Branch, a Wheat Sheaf, the Burning Bush and St. Andrew's Cross. These windows are effectively atmospheric for the interior of the church as well, which is constructed entirely of hardwood.



Two prominent Canadian stained glass artists, Russell Goodman Yvonne and Williams created these windows. Russell Goodman. a native of Fort William, designed and installed the majority of them.

Yvonne Williams, with the assistance Gustav of Weisman, created the Holy Family window which is in the north wall of the gallery.
