

Gifts to Presbyterians Sharing help administer the Avondbloem Fund, established by George and Evelyn van Beek in 1981. This legacy gift supports practical, creative PCC projects that spread the message of Christ. The Raw Carrot Soup Enterprise, a ministry of Paris Presbyterian Church, received a grant to help grow its innovative work. Staff members-who are on social assistance or living with barriers to traditional employment—prepare healthy. homemade soups and stews that are sold in the Paris community and beyond. Proceeds from the sales provide their salaries. Currently, eight people are employed—and two more Raw Carrots will be opening in the next year! This initiative builds self-confidence, provides job training and

iob creation-a living example of Christ's message of love and hope.

October 31, 1517, ninety-five theses were nailed to the door of the Castle Church in Wittenberg, Germany, by Martin Luther. In that moment, the religious order of the world changed and the Protestant Reformation began. An interesting piece of information is, Martin

Luther, a professor of theology, composer, priest, and monk, was not trying to leave the Roman Catholic Church, rather he was trying to reform the practices of the church. Still his writings did not make the Pope of the time very happy as Luther basically said that the Bible was the authority for Christians and not the Pope, and that the people comprised the "priest-hood of all believers." He also challenged the practice of indulgences, which was paying for, in some monetary form, to reduced the impact of a person's sin and time spent in purgatory. The authorities of the church for whom these writings challenged their power and wealth were not impressed, but enough people backed Luther that a movement was born.

This year marks the 500th anniversary of the Protestant Reformation, and October particularly, the nailing of the thesis to the Castle Church door. To honor this and also for our learning (including mine), I am taking on the theme of the Five Solas for the month of October. These five bold affirmations state clearly what the movement came to be about, and are the basis for what we experience in our faith and worship. This is not only history but it is about who we are and how we worship today. It is about our faith and how we can best live out our lives as Christians even in a modern age. Come and see, come and listen, come and be welcomed.
