

This legacy gift supports practical, creative PCC projects that spread the message of Christ. The Raw Carrot Soup Enterprise, a ministry of Paris Presbyterian Church, received a grant to help grow its innovative work. Staff members—who are on social assistance or living with barriers traditional employment—prepare homemade soups and stews that are sold in the Paris community and beyond. Proceeds from the sales provide their salaries. Currently, eight people are employed—and two more Raw Carrots will be opening in the next year! This initiative builds self-confidence, provides job training and

iob creation—a living example of Christ's message of love and hope.

CARING & CONTACT TEA


Caring & Contact are holding their annual tea for Seniors and Shut-ins on Wed. Oct. 25 from 2-4 pm.

From Rev. Joyce,

We are continuing our exploration of the Five Solas of the Reformation. Last week the topic was grace. This week we are looking at Faith. One of my favorite theologians, Rolf Jacobson, explains faith this way, "Part trust, part knowledge, part following —



faith can't be reduced to a few steps; it is a way of life, the walk of a lifetime, one day at a time."* Just like grace, faith cannot be measured, tested, or seen. The point about faith is not how much faith we have, but in whom we have faith. Faith is about who we are and who God is. Thankfully, if God is who the Bible says God is, then our imagination is not able to limit God. God is bigger, more powerful, more compassionate, more forgiving, loving, and amazing, than we are able to comprehend. This is the God to whom we turn, this is the God in whom we place our trust! May your faith increase this week in worship and in work.
