

Throughout the month of October our focus has been on the Five Solas of the Reformation, but today is Reformation Sunday churches world-wide are celebrating the 500th anniversary of the Reformation in worship. It is hard to



imagine in our own time just how incredibly profound were the changes in the 1500's. It rocked the church to it's core. It changed the course of history. The Church would never be the same again. Our way of worship, and that of hundreds of denominations came into being because a monk in Germany by the name of Martin Luther cared enough about the faith of the common people that he challenged the status quo. He challenged the powerful and the rich and in so doing put his own life at risk. He survived, but others did not. This Reformation, the way we understand our salvation as by grace alone, through faith alone, in Christ alone, according to scripture alone, for the glory of God alone, came at great peril and cost. May we be empowered by the Holy Spirit to live out this gift of grace and faith in our own generation and share it as a gift with all, within our families, circles of friends, and with those who God brings us into contact with through times of work and times of recreation. We have good news, so take courage and share it as the treasure it is.
