

A FINANCIAL UPDATE

We are now 8% of the way through 2018 ... already! Our Presbyterian Sharing donations as of January 31st are close to this amount at 7.5% - a difference of \$143. Funds raised to support this Church are lagging behind at 5.5%.



Our insurance fees for St. Andrew's in 2018 was \$9,471 which we paid in January.

With the change in our heating system, we are pleased to announce a savings in January on our heating bill of 27% compared to January 2017.

Thank you to those who gave donations in the Initial Offering envelopes to offset the cost of envelopes. To date we have received \$326. The cost for providing envelopes for 2018 is \$694.

AUTOMATIC EXTERNAL DEFIBRILLATOR

An Automatic External Defibrillator (AED) is located by the Sanctuary doors along with information about the device. The AED pads have recently been replaced & the batteries will need to be replaced in a few months. Regular replacement of these items is required by law. From Rev. Joyce,

If you are someone who watches television at all, then it is pretty hard to ignore the fact that the Olympics have taken place. Ken and I were watching and with it happening in South Korea, we began each morning with live coverage, then caught up with it again in the evening. Like so many others in this country, we had a particular interest in how the Canadian athletes were doing. I marvelled at the dedication, commitment, time, energy, and cost, both financial and personal, that these high caliber athletes gave to be the best at what they do. Regardless of whether or not they medalled, just to have made it to that level speaks to their character. I have found myself reflecting on biblical passages related to this kind of perseverance. One caught my attention from 1 Cor. 9:24-27 "Do you not know that in a race the runners all compete, but only one receives the prize? Run in such a way that you may win it. Athletes exercise self-control in all things; they do it to receive a perishable wreath, but we an imperishable one. So, I do not run aimlessly, nor do I box as though beating the air; but I punish my body and enslave it, so that after proclaiming to others I myself should not be disqualified." Very few of us approach our faith with the dedication of an athlete. The time, cost--both personal and financial--dedication, energy, and commitment, are difficult to attain. Unlike athletes, this prize of abundant and eternal life is there for anyone and everyone, it speaks to our character. May we be inspired in our faith by the dedication of those who give it all for an Olympic medal.
