

From Rev. Joyce,

As I am in Geraldton today and have been for the weekend, I thought I would share the answers to questions that are regularly asked of me when I head up there for ministry. I pretty 3 much always go on my own. I always smile when people wonder about me going up without Ken to drive me, and I think of the number of miles I have put on in all kinds of conditions over the years. My quick response is, "I am a northern girl," but reality is, I like driving. Somehow there is still the assumption that the man should drive, and Ken often does when we are together, but it is not because I can't handle the distances or the weather. When he drives it is so I can sleep! People often think that the ministry to Geraldton just makes me busier, and it does take time, but I do treasure those hours in the vehicle where I can just turn up the tunes and forget about everything except driving. Some time is spent in prayer behind the wheel, but without cell phone service for a good part of the way, and no computer, it is like free time. When I do have cell phone service, I use the blue tooth to catch up with family on the phone. Once in Geraldton, I have some space away in my room at the Bed and Breakfast, and it is just like the pace of things slows down for a few hours. And though I absolutely love ministry in Thunder Bay and wouldn't want to be anywhere else, when I go to Geraldton it is a wonderful reminder of where I have come from--it is much like coming home to the familiar. So, there are the answers to some of those questions. I pray that today as you worship, and in the week ahead, you are blessed. See you next week!
