

# From Rev. Joyce,

Happy Canada Day! I am away on vacation but still wanted to share thoughts with you. To that end I am taking material from a course on prayer that I took before I to ministry. May you find it beloful in your

went into ministry. May you find it helpful in your own walk with God.

What is Prayer? Prayer is an exciting journey into the heart of God. St. Teresa of Avila wrote, "We pray as we are able, we do not pray as we are not able." There ae many aspects to prayer to explore and discover. Not everything will be right for you and what works for you for a period of time may not work forever. All this is normal.

For many people prayer is "a conversation with God." It is a time set apart to talk with God as we would with any other friend or acquaintance. Any one of us can pray with words that are heartfelt and simple to a God who loves us as we are and desires to spend time with us.

The word "conversation" implies a reciprocal communication. We talk to God and God talks to us. Conversation requires that we learn not only how to express ourselves plainly and openly, but also that we learn to hear what God may be saying to us. As difficult as it is to talk to God, it's listening to God that often causes distress. Where do we hear God What does God sound like? How doe this happen? In the Reformed tradition God speaks to us first and foremost through Holy Scripture, especially in the Gospels which give accounts of the ultimate revelation of God to us in Jesus Christ. God speaks to us in the preached Word as well. We also hear God's voice through other vehicles of worship such as hymns. Sometimes God speaks to us through other people or circumstances or through gifts of nature and music. When God speaks to us there is movement deep within our beings. God is heard not with audible words, but with insights. Theses take place through our intellect, imagination, feeling, health and other subtle movements of the Holy Spirit. We know that such insights are from God when they are in accordance with Scripture and move us toward the most loving action. ©The Elder's Institute, 2007

#### **Parents of Young Children**

We are so glad that you are here, and that you brought your children with you! Thank you! A few suggestions for your worship experience:

- Relax! God put the wiggle in children; don't feel you have to suppress it in God's house.
- ◆ It can be helpful to sit towards the front where it is easier for children to see and hear.
- ◆ Sing hymns, pray & respond with enthusiasm. Children learn behavior by copying you. If you are excited about God, they will be too!
- ◆ There is a children's time with the minister during each service. After this time there are activities & books available for the children on the mat along the south wall. Please sit close to the children to aid in their activities & to be handy should your child need you.
- Teach children the Lord's Prayer; being able to join in with the prayers helps children feel they are contributing too.
- Attend worship often. Children like & need routines where they can participate.

To those sitting near parents & children: A smile of encouragement is always welcome to parents with small, active children!
Jesus welcomed the little children, and, here at St. Andrew's, we do too!
