I do I am writing this from Senior Pres B Camp. That means youth going into grade nine through twelve can attend. At this moment it is 10:55pm and I am listening to eleven young women chattering about everything from Caitlyn Jenner to the Kardashians, to the Yodeling Walmart boy (I had to look that one up on YouTube), to Nicki Manaj. Then as the hour gets later the voices get fewer and quieter. The lights are turned out and we have gone from awake to bedtime without me having to say a word. They have requested that the lights go out. Then the rain begins to softly fall. We go from talking about the latest things they have seen on the internet to being lulled by God's creation. These girls, in fact all these kids love camp. Most have been coming to camp since their childhood and know each other well. Even so, they are very good at welcoming a young man into the fold who has never been to camp. Here they build community. Some have not seen each other since last year, others go to school together, but they are wonderful at including everyone. There is a long tradition here, started by those who cared enough to give of themselves to make it happen and continues through those who will not let it go because they believe it is too important. It is a place to build friendships and create memories. It is a safe place that allows enough freedom for these youth to experience and learn more about themselves. others, and God. I give thanks to all of

you that our ministry at St. Andrew's allows me to be here. It is a gift.
