WHITE GIFT SUNDAY

The tradition of White Gift Sunday has its roots in a small Methodist church in Ohio in 1904. The story is told that a minister's wife initiated the idea to solve the problem of inequity of gifts given at the Sunday school Christmas party. Instead of focusing on receiving gifts, the focus shifted to bringing gifts to Jesus that could in turn be shared with people around the world who did not have much. All the gifts would come wrapped in plain white paper, so that no one would know which was an expensive gift and which was a more modest one. No one would feel ashamed of their gift and everyone would share in the joy of giving to others. In keeping with the spirit of the first White Gift service, donations will be accepted and then brought to the Thunder Bay Food Bank.

We will be extending this occasion to include next Sunday, so everyone who wishes to bring a gift may do so on Dec. 23rd.

Today marks the 3rd Sunday of Advent with the Worship Series celebrating the Carols of Christmas. The following is the text for the lighting of the Advent Candle so that you can ponder it throughout the week. May these readings and our worship prepare your heart, mind, and body for the wonder of the Christmas message.

The Candle of Joy

Joy to the world! the Lord is come. This well-known and beloved Christmas hymn calls upon all of creation to make a joyful noise before God, for the Lord has come to judge the earth and restore his creation. In Genesis 3, the greatest tragedy in all of Scripture occurs. Adam and Eve sin against God and are banished from the garden as God puts a curse upon the ground. Yet God is merciful and full of grace. God declares that the woman shall bear offspring that will crush the head of the serpent. Jesus, the Son of Man and Son of God, will come to break the curse, to renew the creation, to make whole what now is broken. The coming of Christ into this world marks the beginning of that restoration. Christ brings joy to the world, a light where there is darkness, growth where there is decay. And we, along with all creation, respond with a song of praise. As we light this third candle of Advent, let us remember that our Lord has come, and he will come again. He will reign as King, and all nations will show forth the glories of his righteousness and the wonders of his love.
