RAINBOW COMMUNION

Is a special LGBTQI Listening Committee consisting of seven members drawn from across the church reflecting the diversity of the Presbyterian Church in Canada (PCC) and includes two members who identify as LGBTQI. Their mandate is to offer a safe and respectful environment in which confidentiality is assured in order to encourage people to tell stories of harm done to them within and by the church because of homophobia, heterosexism and transphobia; and to share stories of God's grace experienced by them and through them in Christian ministry, even in the midst of the challenges they have faced. To invite people to submit their stories orally or in writing. To provide, after the listening process is completed, an appropriate response to the issue of homophobia within the PCC with recommendations for concrete actions addressing homophobia to the General Assembly for implementation within the church.

On the evening of **Sunday April 14** and throughout the day on **Monday April 15th**, St. Andrew's will be offering a safe space and respectful environment for the Rainbow Communion of the PCC to meet with people. A PCC MISSION MOMENT World Health Day (April 7)

Good health starts with good nutrition—especially for young children. In a poor village in Haiti, oneyear-old Marcellus was losing weight rapidly and had a persistent cough. Because of crop losses, his single mother was struggling to feed the little boy and his five siblings. She knew Marcellus needed medical attention, but the price of transport to the closest health facility was more than she could afford. Hope came to Marcellus's mother in the form of a mobile clinic supported by Presbyterian World Service & Development and other Canadian Foodgrains Bank members. There, Marcellus received a nutrient-rich food supplement called Nourimanba, antibiotics and multi-

vitamins. Marcellus is no longer malnourished and is on course to grow up healthy and strong. *PWS&D brings health care closer to home*

Today is the last Sunday in Lent, so let me take this moment to encourage you to plan for Holy Week. Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter Sunday

- these are the worship services available to you April 14 – 21. Each service has a different focus, a reason for being. It is a holy time. It is an opportunity unlike any other in the church year to understand what it means that Jesus lived a human life, died a brutal death, and then arose. It offers a hope that we might know and experience God through the power of the Holy Spirit moving in our lives. When we jump from Palm Sunday to Easter Sunday, we miss the suffering that speaks to our suffering, the heartache that reaches into our heartache, the love that God displayed in this single revolutionary act of redemption. God offers us love, forgiveness of sins, and life, not just in death; but, especially now, in us living out each day that we are given breath! If you have never chosen to attend these services, prayerfully consider whether this is the year. If you have come to these services once or often, may you find yourselves embracing again the story that has changed lives and in so doing find new hope, love, and understanding for your faith.
