## From Rev. Joyce

This past week I have been reminded of how much can change. And there will be a change in the pulpit as I take the next three Sundays for vacation. Pastor Kerry McLaughlin will be leading worship. I know the rest will be good for me. It can also be healthy for the congregation to hear someone else share the gospel from time to time.
