





### A WORSHIP SERVICE

#### IS LIKE A SOCCOR GAME (2 of 4)

Too often children understand worship as a long program or play which is put on by others and which they do not understand. They see their role as being quiet, patient, and wondering if the adults are right when they say "you'll understand it one day." A different vision can make a big difference. Children can be told that a worship service is like a soccer game. **The people in the pews (including them) are the players on the field. The preachers, worship leaders, choirs and instrument players are coaches.** The people "up front" are calling in plays and directions, but it is the people in the pews who actually do the worshipping. The challenge for children (and all worshippers) is to get in the game rather than just sit there. For young worshippers there are four basic plays to worship:



2. Praying – We talk to God about whatever is going on in our lives and in our world. Each of us has our own list of things to pray about each Sunday. We also hear what other worshippers are praying about and pray with them.

### From Rev. Joyce

If you are in church today you will be aware that I am not in the pulpit leading worship. I am in Geraldton this weekend to baptize three-year old twin girls! As many of you know, in the Presbyterian Church we have responsibilities, not only to our own church, but to others within our denomination as well. This goes for ministers and congregations as a whole. Over the years, when this congregation (St. Andrew's Thunder Bay) has been without a minister other ministers in Thunder Bay have stepped in the role of Interim-Moderator to help lead, guide, and give support to the congregation on behalf of the Presbytery of Superior. It is part of the system that is good, but it also means that your minister can be called upon to do the same for another congregation, which is the situation for St. Andrew's Geraldton. In their case this is a long-term commitment. It is a both a gift and a responsibility we have for one another in the church. I have been asked whether or not my role will change now that St. Andrew's Geraldton is heading into a formally recognized shared ministry with St. James Anglican, and the short answer is no. I will continue to have the same role with the same responsibilities. This fall I will be making one more trip than normal in order to be with the two congregations and representatives of the Anglican Church as we celebrate this new ministry within both our denominations. So, I will be in Geraldton Sept 22, Nov 3, and a yet to be determined Sunday in December. This work is a reminder that we are not Christians in isolation from one another. We work as one body in Christ. Thank you for how you support me in ministering to others within the PCC and in the community.

##### Spreading the gospel message

Just as the early disciples travelled to share the good news of the gospel, Cariboo Presbyterian Church is working to spread the love of Christ to rural and remote regions of British Columbia, with support from Presbyterians Sharing. The "southern" part of the ministry is made up of five house churches around the 100 Mile House and Lac La Hache areas. Combined, the house churches reach more than 150 people who reside in areas that are considered beyond the reach of the traditional church. Bruce Wilcox has served as the southern region's leader for the past several years and credits the ministry's consistent growth to the work of the Holy Spirit and the desire for God's family to gather in community despite geographical challenges.
